



This site contains a variety of remnants of the Ice Age Floods from some 10,000 years ago. The attributes are easily viewed by the public in a short walk. It contains a ‘kettle’, a pond created by a rock swirling in a whirlpool during one of the floods. It also provides a view of a sand dune created on the south side of the Columbia River created by a deposition during the flood. Native American hunting blinds are visible. Rare plants species and a riparian area and wetlands occupy other portions of the property.

The Dosewallips River contains four salmon species listed under the Endangered Species Act. Recovery of those species is a statewide high priority. Acquiring the parcel protects over 3.5 miles of valuable riparian habitat along the south side of the river. The owner seeks to sell an entire parcel, even though some is not adjoining the river. The property also provides recreation opportunity as it includes a former railroad grade suitable for pedestrian, equestrian and cycling use; this can connect users to the Olympic National Forest.

Acquire a highly threatened and critical property that includes an endangered prairie plant population, imperiled old-growth forest community, a 2,200-foot-long naturally functioning feeder bluff system, and numerous fish and wildlife species dependent on these habitats. The forest community is a WA Natural Heritage Plan (WNHP) Priority 2 (Douglas fir-western hemlock oceanspray/ swordfern), one of only 7 known occurrences in WA. The golden paintbrush population is a WNHP Priority 1 and one of only 12 remaining in the world. The feeder bluffs and adjacent kelp and eelgrass beds are designated as Critical Fish and Wildlife Areas by Island County.



The property contains undisturbed wetlands and beach area that may prove valuable for salmon habitat.



Acquiring this site will provide a buffer between the public using the property and residential sites to the west of the property.


