Provide a detailed description of the proposed project:

This restoration project enhances off-channel, aquatic habitat at the outlets of two existing side channel/flood overflow channels of the East Fork Lewis River (EFLR), Clark County. The sponsor, Clark County, is proposing to grade along the upper side-channel for 100 feet in order to improve off-channel habitat from the mainstem EFLR to the existing backwater habitat at low flow periods. The sponsor will place large wood along 300 feet of the upper side-channel to diversify the habitat. The sponsor will grade along 220 feet of the lower side-channel outlet in order to improve fish access at low flows in the 1,200 foot long side channel. The lower side-channel is characterized by significant pool and riffle habitat in a forested environment. Grading along the lower side-channel will also expand the existing backwater pool by 3,500 square feet. The sponsor will place several large wood structures along the lower side-channel to provide scour that will prevent sedimentation and to diversify habitat. The sponsor will also treat approximately 1.5 acres of invasive vegetation and install approximately 0.8 acres of riparian vegetation. The lower mainstem EF Lewis contains important spawning and rearing habitat for fall Chinook, chum, and coho and rearing habitat for steelhead.

Describe existing project site conditions.

The site was purchased by Clark County in May, 2000 as a segment of the East Fork Lewis River Greenway. Prior to county acquisition, the property was managed as timber land. The property is located along a Tier 1 segment of the East Fork Lewis River subbasin. Fall Chinook, Coho, Chum, summer and winter steelhead are all designated as primary species in the East Fork for salmon recovery.

Creation and diversification of the proposed off-channel habitat will require approximately 1,250 cy of grading. Excavation will use heavy equipment.
