#### Provide a detailed description of the proposed project:

The Hood Canal Salmon Enhancement Group (HCSEG) is requesting funds to purchase 18 parcels in an area of lower Big Quilcene River. The 18 parcels represent the last remaining unprotected land of the lower river, and are critical to completing the last stages of a multi-phased restoration effort in Quilcene Bay. This will be a fee simple acquisition of approximately 30 acres and include the demolition and removal of structures and derelict equipment. The project located in Jefferson County in the town of Quilcene. The project area is located within T27NR02WS24 and T27NR01WS19. The acquisition will provide protection from further development in the lower segment of the river and provide the opportunity to remove current development impacts (structures, derelict equipment, etc.). The project will protect estuarine tidelands and saltmarsh, and river riparian associated with the river channel and the river floodplain. The project area is intended to specifically benefit multiple salmon species (chinook, coho, fall chum, summer chum, pink) which use the area, as well as coastal cutthroat, steelhead and bull trout. The land acquisition area is also known to support Bald eagle, harbor seal, and waterfowl concentrations. Seventeen contiguous parcels will comprise the restoration. All parcels will be protected.

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#### Describe existing project site conditions.

The property has been diked since the 1880's and has been used for agriculture, wood production, and has been developed for homes. Currently there are six houses on the property and all other uses have ceased.

Once purchased we will remove the houses, out buildings and infrastructure and level the property in preparation for further restoration. We will also restore 3 acres of this property to full saltmarsh to approximate what was there in 1883.
