Provide a detailed description of the proposed project:

The goal of the Porter Levee Restoration Project is to prepare a preliminary project design to maximize the restoration potential of the King County-owned Porter Levee Natural Area project site. This will be achieved by removing up to 1,300 feet of an existing training levee to restore channel migration and habitat-forming processes. Targeted species are Chinook, steelhead, and coho. Construction funding is projected to come from a number of sources, including the Corps of Engineers, King County, the King Conservation District, SRFB, and PSAR. Using this grant, King County will: 1) develop a surveyed site plan; 2) perform a wetland study; 3) perform a geotechnical study; 4) perform a hydrologic analysis; 5) prepare preliminary design plan drawings; 6) prepare a design report and 7) prepare an engineering cost estimate for construction of the project.

Describe existing project site conditions.

Porter Levee is public land managed by King County Department of Natural Resources and Parks. Prior to public ownership, this site was used for agricultural activities, mostly pasture and livestock grazing. Salmon habitat function onsite was minimal due to the existence of the levee separating the floodplain from the river.
