Provide a detailed description of the proposed project:

As part of the ongoing Mashel River Eatonville Reach Protection and Restoration Initiative, this project proposes to acquire at least three additional properties. All three properties include Mashel River shoreline and expand the existing block of protected shoreline properties in this reach to 250 acres. These acquisitions will permanently protect and bring an additional 29 acres into conservation ownership and management and ensure available habitat for Chinook salmon and steelhead trout in an important channel-migration zone. The project is located along the Mashel River, the largest tributary to the Nisqually River, near Eatonville, Pierce County.

Describe existing project site conditions.

The Hamilton property was previously part of a lumber mill yard but has not been used for at least thirty years. It does not contain any structures or other improvements. Sections of the riparian areas have been cleared or thinned but have been replanted within the last two years as part of salmon-recovery efforts along the Mashel River. The Thureson property has never been developed or used in any way and retains almost full forest cover. The Van Eaton II property is part of an old homestead and has a barn but beyond that is undeveloped, with approximately half the property in a heavily forested slope that descends to the Mashel River. All three sites contain Mashel River shoreline that provides spawning, incubation, and rearing habitat for Chinook salmon and steelhead trout. In addition, coho and pink salmon have been documented spawning at the Van Eaton II site.
